Nurturing the Seeds of Potential

elen Kim has been a valued MTC tutor since 2017. In her first three years at MTC, Helen tutored at Graham Middle School. Her students faced unique challenges, many coming from single-parent households with numerous responsibilities at home taking care of younger siblings, which didn't allow much time for homework. Helen was determined to make learning educational and enjoyable by creating fun games for her students. She would remind her students, "learning is a life-long process and flexing your brain muscle is the best exercise you can get".

Helen shifted her focus to tutoring ELD learners at Castro and Vargas schools in Mountain View, schools that have a large population of immigrant and refugee students. Helen's own journey as an immigrant allows her to deeply understand her students. Her family moved from South Korea to Argentina, immersing her in a Spanish-speaking classroom. Helen recalls being overwhelmed by the experience of not understanding the language. She shares her unique story of being a two-time immigrant, to Argentina and then to the United States, allowing her to connect with her students on a profound level. Helen describes the transformation she witnesses in her students when she says, "you can see the love and light in their eyes when they begin to believe in themselves."



PROGRAM IMPACT

Tutor Program

TC's Tutor Program supports over 200 K-8th grade students in the Mountain View and Los Altos school districts. A significant number of these students lack access to personalized academic assistance. MTC provides one-on-one tutors, Reading Fellows (an intensive reading program), and Homework Club.

velyn was a freshman at Los Altos High when MTC matched her with Karen Jones, a new mentor (now MTC Board member) whose children had moved on to college and beyond. Evelyn wasn't doing well in school and spent much of her time taking care of her younger brother while her parents worked. College was not something Evelyn imagined. Her parents had a junior high education and she assumed that her path would be working and supporting her family. Karen quickly realized that Evelyn was smart, kind, but lacked confidence, perhaps due to being very sheltered.

Over their three years together, Karen and Evelyn have shared many experiences like visiting San Francisco, Monterey Bay Aquarium, and attending the Nutcracker Ballet. The extra bonus? Karen's entire family has embraced Evelyn including the grandparents, her brother's and sister's families and their children. Evelyn is now being cheered on by an extended family.

The results are tangible. Evelyn now holds a job at a local restaurant and has a 3.9 GPA and isn't just excelling academically; she's redefining her future. Evelyn and Karen have embarked on the college application process, a journey that seemed improbable just a few years ago. "For me, it's been exciting to watch Evelyn's confidence build as she takes on new opportunities in her academic and personal life. We're all so excited to see where her future takes her."





PROGRAM IMPACT

Mentor Program

TC's Mentor Program matches vulnerable high school students with caring adults who support the emotional health of their mentees and empower young people to hope and plan for a bright future. Students in the program typically have significant stressors in their lives that are impacting their mental health, school engagement, or social interactions.


